Detention as a Last Resort

- Fundamental principle of international law
- Central to creating a more effective and humane youth justice system
- Underpins that detention be used in limited circumstances violent offences
- Applies to all forms of detention including detention on remand



Irish Law and Policy

- Children Act 2001, s 96
 - Detention as a last resort as sentencing principle
- Children Act 2001, s 144
 - Detention is the only suitable way for dealing with the child
- National Youth Justice Strategy Goals 08-11
 - Implementation of community-based sanctions
 - Delivery of safe, secure detention for children




Use of Detention in 2008 - CDS

- 123 children detained in Children Detention Schools (u 16s)
- Average occupancy 46
- 44 received a detention order
- Approx 1/3 on remand 44% went on to be sentenced to detention



Origins of Children in Detention





Use of Detention 2008 - St Patrick's

- **112** 16 year olds and **129** 17 year olds.
 - Total **241** detained in 2008.
- 161 were sentenced to detention
 - Approx 1/3 on remand
- 25% on protection (Inspector of Prisons)



Transfer to CDS

- Consistent recommendation of national and international monitoring bodies
- Legislative intent in Criminal Justice Act 2006
- 2008 NYJ Strategy no clear commitment
- Dependent on building of new Detention School 2012 ?
- Vital that plans are expedited Plan B



Use of International Standards

- Detailed and comprehensive standards from UN and Council of Europe
- Blueprint for detention services that are consistent with best practice
- Important benchmark against which to measure progress and reform
