Children's Rights Behind Bars: Where are we now?

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Role of OCO

- Dual statutory mandate
 - Independent, impartial complaints handling
 - Promotion of children's rights
 - Monitor and advise on legislation and public policy
 - Promote awareness of children's rights, including among children
 - Consult children and highlight their concerns
 - Undertake or commission research

Children in detention OCO remit

- Investigations into the administration of prisons
 - excluded by 2002 Act
- Calls for an extension of remit
 - From 2005 onwards, the OCO recommended that St Patrick's Institution be included in its investigative remit, which was raised by way of:
 - Annual reports,
 - UN Committee on the Rights of the Child
 - Council of Europe's Committee for the Prevention of Torture and Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment.

Consultation with young people

- Report: Young people in St Patrick's Institution
 - A consultation project into the lives of young people in St Patrick's Institution
 - A DVD to highlight the views of young people in St Pat's
 - An information booklet dealing with young people's first night in the prison
 - An information booklet explaining the prison regime and rules

Extension of the 2002 Act

 In June 2012, Ministerial Order to extend remit to include prisons and therefore St. Patrick's Institution.

S.I. No. 210/2012 - Ombudsman for Children Act 2002 (Section 11(2)(a)) Order 2012.

- Complaints of young people under 18 detained in St.
 Patrick's Institution and Wheatfield Prison and for up to two years after could now be examined.
- Since 2012, complaints have been investigated by OCO and active engagement in this area continues

Concerns raised with OCO by young people and advocates

- Contact with parent when serious injuries and assault had occurred
- Adequacy of medical treatment
- Withholding of family open visits
- Mental health of young people
- Unfair Treatment by staff
- Access to complaint handling
