FORMAT

Full-time: 1 year, approx 7 contact hrs. per week plus dissertation

Part-time: 2 years, approx 3.5 contact hrs. per week plus dissertation

ADMISSION CRITERIA

Applicants will normally hold a second class honours degree (Level 8), lower division (2.2) or higher in the area of social science, law, sociology, psychology or cognate discipline.

Applicants who do not meet the minimum academic requirements, but who have significant professional or vocational experience in the criminal justice system shall also be considered. In addition to an application form, this latter category may also be asked to present for interview.

All applicants will be shortlisted on the basis of their academic qualifications and work experience
